McIntyre, E. 1999. 1999 Synoptic Trapnet Survey

- Smallmouth Bass comprised 52.9% of the catch while Northern Pike represented 14.6% and Walleye was 11.5%.
- Walleye C.U.E. is one of the lowest in the Parry Sound Area.
- Smallmouth bass abundance is relatively high compared to other surveyed lakes in the Parry Sound District

Management Prescription:

Voluntary Prescription

- Barbless hooks, leadless sinkers and slot size
- Release Small and Largemouth Bass between 12 and 17 inches and walleye between 15 to 20 inches
